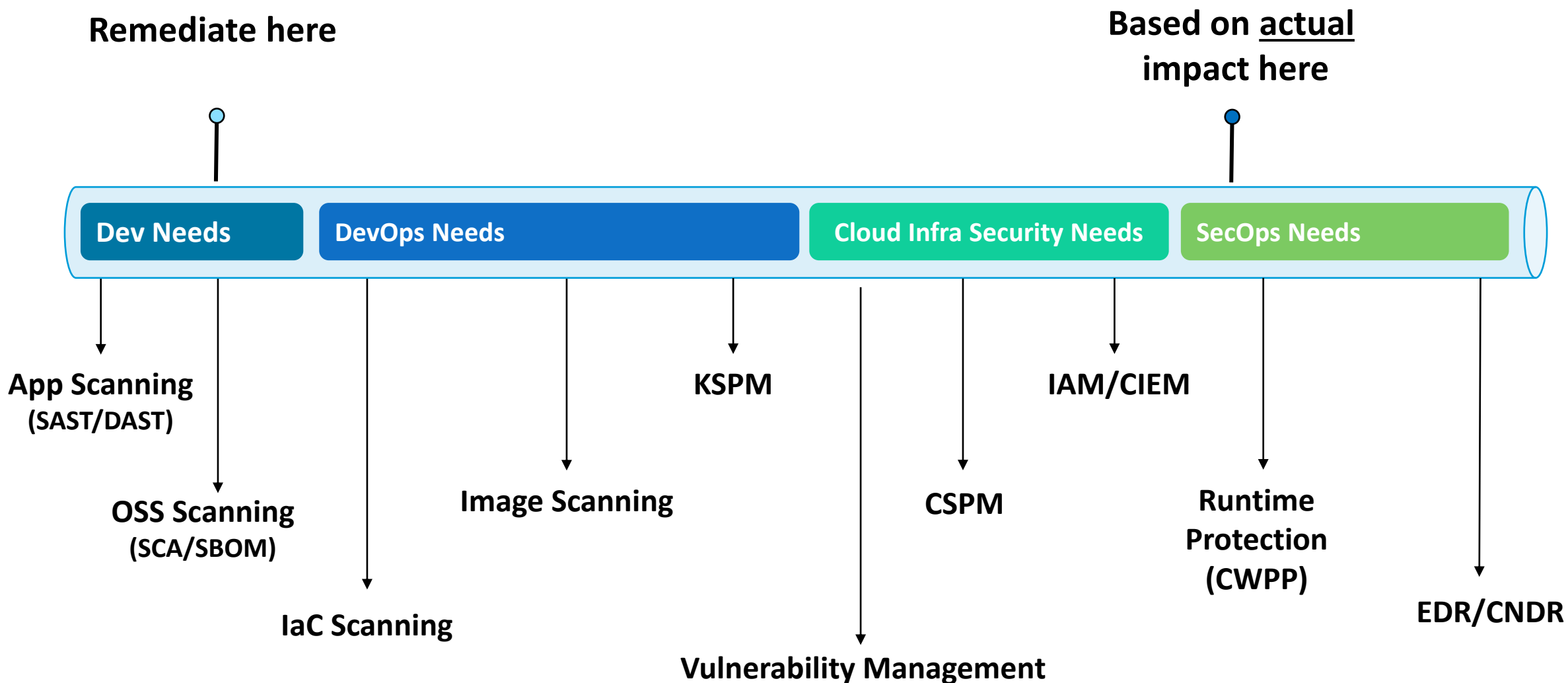

Cybersecurity Layoffs Expand As Employers Look for Savings

The job cuts reflect worries about the economy after years of rapid cyber growth

A trio of cybersecurity companies said this month that they plan to lay off hundreds of employees, adding to concerns of further squeezes on an industry that has already been rocked by changing economic conditions.

The most recent layoffs pile onto several other cyber companies' announcements that they would reduce staff this year.

Cybersecurity companies have largely been seen as shielded from economic turbulence, and high-profile hacks have spurred investments in startups offering protective tools and consulting services. But the new layoffs reflect how cyber companies' rapid growth has met a harsh climate as the economy has worsened, analysts say.

Rapid7, a Boston-based cybersecurity company, said it is laying off around 18% of its workforce, affecting over 400 employees. Chief Executive Corey Thomas said on an earnings call last week that the layoffs are critical for Rapid7 to become more profitable in 2024, even as the company broadly met Wall Street expectations this quarter.

"While it may be surprising to take this measure when we are meeting performance expectations, making decisions from a place of strength allows us the opportunity to restructure intentionally," Thomas said in a memo sent to employees last week. Rapid7 declined to comment beyond its public statements.

Atlanta-based **Secureworks**

told employees Monday that it is laying off around 15% of employees, or over 300 staff members. The company said in a regulatory filing that the layoffs are part of a broader plan to cut costs and focus on "improving operating margins over time." Expenses including severance pay and termination benefits could run up to \$14.2 million, the Dell-owned company said, adding that it was also looking at how it could reduce its physical locations to save money.

The uptick in cybersecurity job seekers gained steam late last year and is continuing, said Mark Sasson, managing partner at Pinpoint Search Group, a recruiting firm in cybersecurity.

While federal and local governments have made significant pushes to expand cyber workforce in recent months, including the release of a national administration strategy by the Biden administration and the inclusion of workforce goals in New York state's cyber plan, the commercial side of the industry has been battered by the economy in recent years.

The economic downturn has made a dent in the cybersecurity industry after years of rapid expansion due to lofty stock prices, easy access to in-

vestment dollars and a general rise in cybercrime. "A lot of these companies have overreached. They tried to grow far too quickly," said Andy Watkin-Child, founding partner at cyber and risk consulting firm **Parava Security Solutions**.

Vendors have also had to contend with changing behavior from the customers. Chief information security officers and other executives have become more selective with purchases, as their own budgets have felt the impact of economic uncertainty. Many say they are no longer looking for individual products to solve single problems, but prefer platforms that can solve a range of issues.

Sales cycles now sometimes take several months longer than in the past as companies spend more time scrutinizing spending decisions. Pinpoint Search Group's Sasson said. One of his cybersecurity clients recently needed 12 months to finalize a contract with a large manufacturing firm, a process that used to take six months, he said. When the deal went through, it needed approval from a high-up executive at the manufacturer instead of only from the company's chief information security officer, as it

had in the past.

There will likely be more growth among cybersecurity vendors in the coming year as new regulations force companies in different industries to step up security protections, Watkin-Child said. The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission approved new rules in July that require public companies to report cyberattacks within four business days if the breaches will have a material effect. In Europe, coming rules will require critical infrastructure and financial services firms to report incidents to regulators.

"The next three-to-five years are going to be a great opportunity for the cyber market," Watkin-Child said.

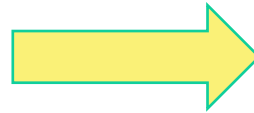
Other cybersecurity companies have also shed employees over the past few months.

StackerOne, which manages bug-bounty programs that reward security researchers who identify flaws in corporate systems, is reducing its headcount by about 12%—or over 40 employees—CEO Marten Mickos said in an email to staff on Aug. 2.

Dragos, a company specializing in providing threat intelligence and tools for operational technology providers, laid off around 50 of its employees in June, roughly 9% of its workforce.

Other companies that cut staff this year include Tempe, Ariz.-based **Bishop Fox**, which cited the uncertain economy when it said in May that it would lay off about 50 employees, or 13% of its workforce.

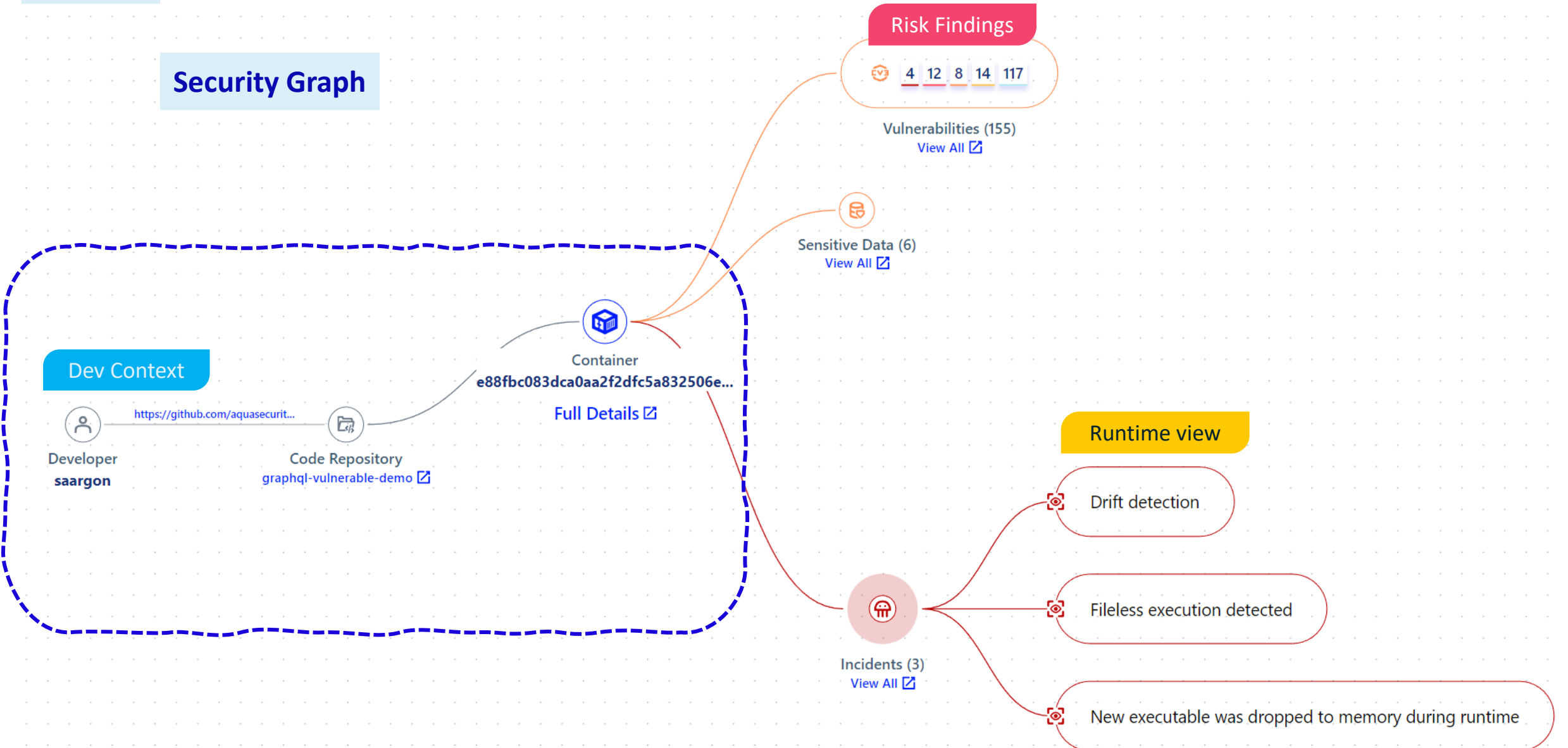

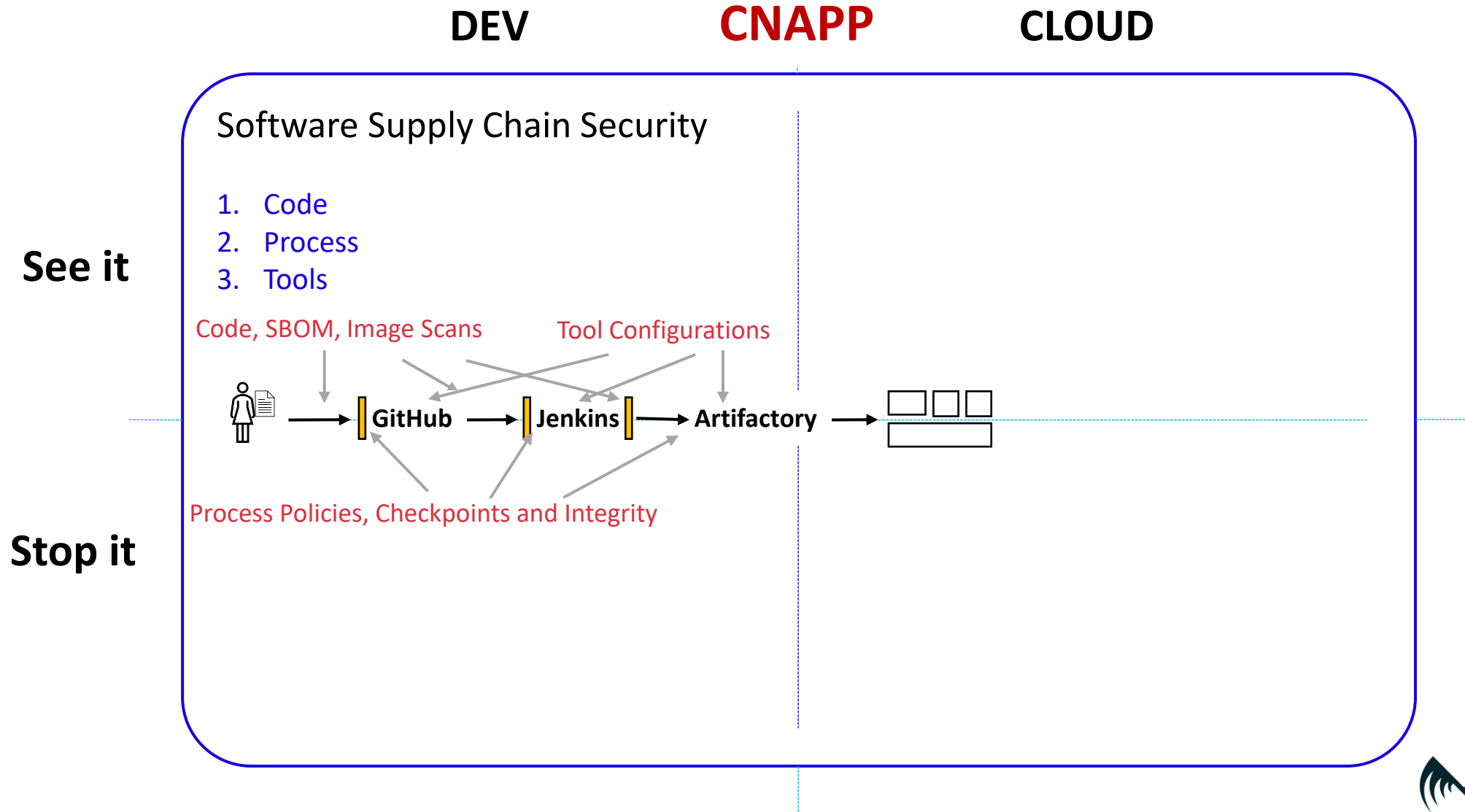

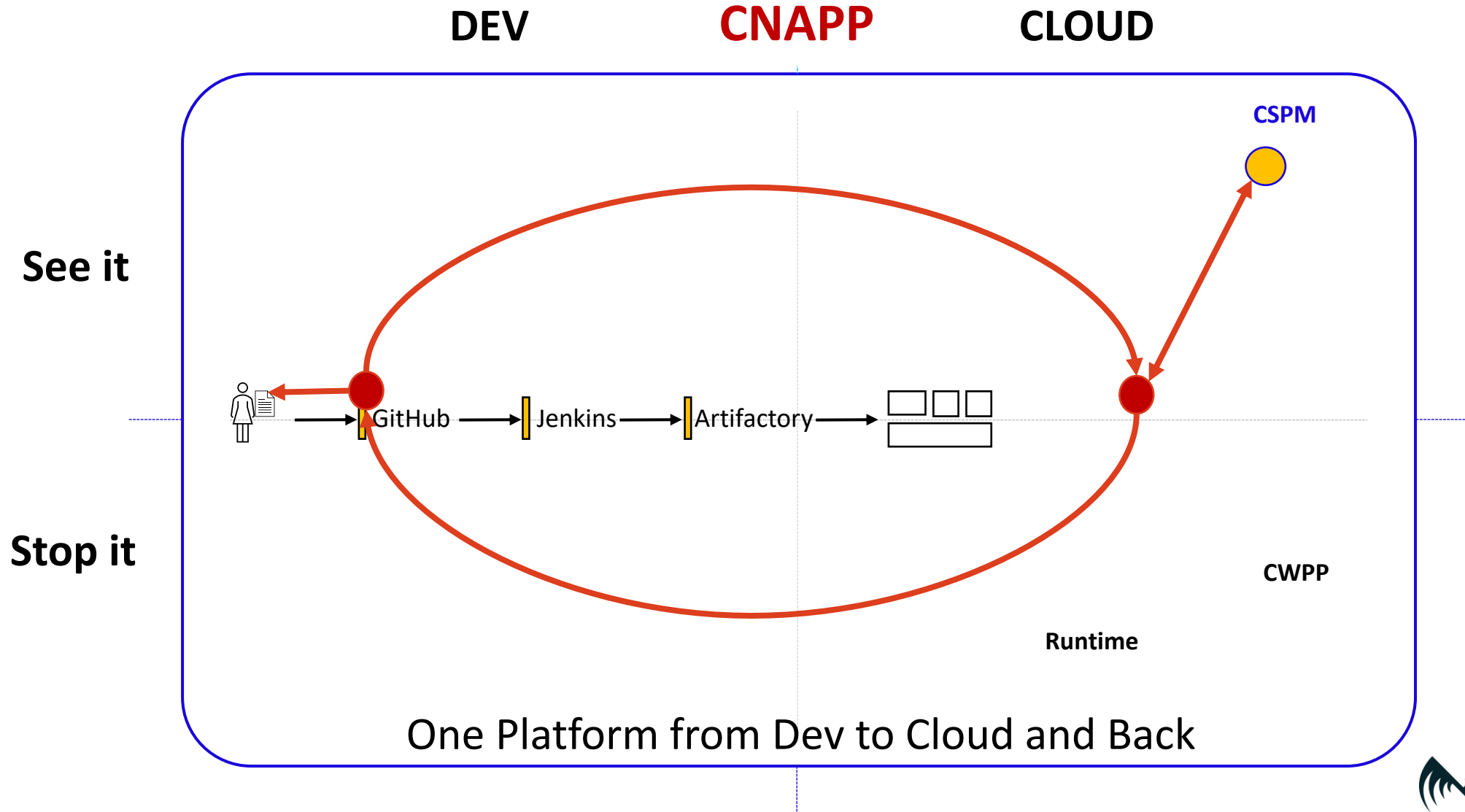
Security Graph

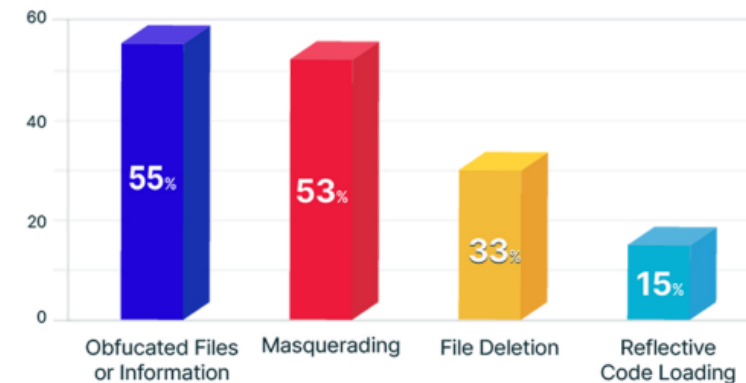

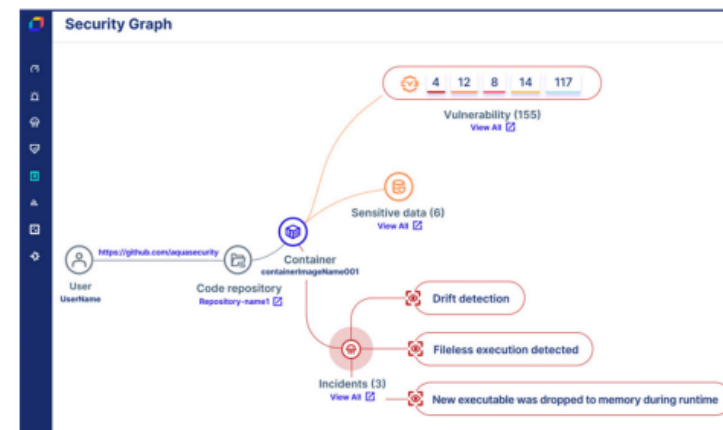
